For if I preach the gospel, that gives me
no ground for boasting. For necessity is
laid upon me. Woe to me if I do not
preach the gospel! For if I do this of my
own will, I have a reward; but if not of
my own will, I am entrusted with a
commission. What then is my reward?
Just this: that in my preaching I may
make the gospel free of charge, not
making full use of my right in the gospel.
For though I am free from all men, I have
made myself a slave to all, that I might
win the more. To the weak I became
weak, that I might win the weak. I have
become all things to all men, that I might
by all means save some. I do it all for
the sake of the gospel, that I may share
in its blessings.

Gospel: Luke (5:1-11)

While the people pressed upon him to
hear the word of God, Jesus was
standing by the lake of Gennes'aret. And
he saw two boats by the lake; but the
fishermen had gone out of them and
were washing their nets. Getting into
one of the boats, which was Simon's, he
asked him to put out a little from the
land. And he sat down and taught the
people from the boat. And when he had
ceased speaking, he said to Simon, "Put
out into the deep and let down your nets
for a catch." And Simon answered,
"Master, we toiled all night and took
nothing! But at your word I will let down
the nets." And when they had done this,
they enclosed a great shoal of fish; and
as their nets were breaking, they
beckoned to their partners in the other
boat to come and help them. And they
came and filled both the boats, so that
they began to sink. But when Simon
Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus'
knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am
a sinful man, O Lord." For he was
astonished, and all that were with him,
at the catch of fish which they had
taken; and so also were James and John,
sons of Zeb'edee, who were partners
with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon,
"Do not be afraid; henceforth you will be
catching men." And when they had
brought their boats to land, they left
everything and followed him.
